

Peter Bach, Forrest, Dies Suddenly

Peter Bach, a well-known resident of Forrest, passed away there last Saturday morning shortly after 11 o'clock. Mr. Bach had for many years resided north of Forrest, moving to that village a few weeks ago. Last Saturday morning he was to have met a party at the Bach Lumber office in Forrest. When he did not put in an appearance a telephone call was made to his home. When Mrs. Bach went to look for him he was found at the grade door landing having evidently passed away with a heart attack. He was aged 72 years, four months and 24 days.

Mr. Bach was a well-known minister of the Apostolic Christian Church.

Mr. Bach was born in Alsace Lorraine, December 10, 1873. When seven years of age he came with other members of the family to America, landing at New York, December 6, 1880. They located at Wisner, Neb., where they resided until 1892, when the family moved to this vicinity. Since 1896 Mr. Bach had resided on the home place near Forrest, until he moved into Forrest in March.

On April 20, 1902, at the Apostolic Christian Church in this city, He was united in marriage to Miss Lena Scharlach, and they took up their home on a farm northeast of this city.

She survives, together with the following children: George, Edward Bach, Mrs. William Honegger, Mrs. Paul Schrof, all of Forrest; Mrs. John Joos, of Princeville; Mrs. Dan Schlatter, of Chatsworth; Carl Bach, Phoenix, Ariz., and Reuben Bach, of Fairbury. Surviving also are two brothers, J. N. Bach, of Fairbury, and Emil Bach, of Norfolk, Neb., and fourteen grandchildren.

Funeral services were held at the North Apostolic Christian Church on Tuesday morning at 10:30 o'clock and interment was in the church cemetery. The services were largely attended. He had been the presiding minister of that church for many years.

Among the relatives attending the services from a distance were Mr. and Mrs. Emil Bach, of Norfolk, Neb., and Chris Scharlach and daughter, Geneva, of Algona, Iowa.

The funeral services of Jacob Baer who passed away last Friday morning at his home, 606 East Elm Street, were held at the home Sunday afternoon and interment was made at Graceland. Mr. Baer had been ill and confined to his bed for the past eleven weeks.

Jacob Baer was born in Zuzenhauzen, Germany, October 26, 1857. He was married to Magdalene Hunsinger in 1884, and came to the United States in September 1912, locating first at Morton. A year later the family moved to a farm north of Cropsey, where they lived until removing to the present home in Fairbury nine years ago.

There are surviving nine children: Emil, Peoria; Chris and Fred, Morton; Mrs. John Kaeb, Rankin; Jacob and Mrs. Carl Widmer, Cropsey; Mrs. Carl Aberle, Strawn; Anna Marie, at home.

Services were held at the Apostolic Christian Church, Tuesday at 10 a.m. for the Rev. Emil Bahler, 67, who died at his home at 9:20 p.m. Saturday. He had been ill for three years.

Services were held at the Bahler home south of Fairbury at 9:30 a.m. Tuesday. Buried was in the South Apostolic Christian Cmetery.

He was born Dec. 24, 1891, at Fairbury, a son of Jacob and Nina Keller Bahler. He married Ida Steffen at Fairbury, Feb. 8, 1920.

They moved to a farm in Belle Prairie Township, where they made their home for 39 years.

The town has lost another old and desirable citizen, in death of Mr. Robert Bahler, Sr. who passed away at the Home Hospital in Lafayette, Friday at 1:45 a.m. where he had been a patient for a week.

Mr. Bahler's health had been failing for over a year, and for some time preceding his death he had been in a serious condition. He was one of Remington's most respected and honored citizens and was an enterprising business man, being connected with the firm of Bahler's feed store since its inception. He retired from the farm some years ago, and since that time had been one of our business men.

A native of Berne, Switzerland, he was born May 30, 1863, and came to America about 50 years ago. He had lived in Remington and Vicinity 30 years. His wife, who was Matilda Waibel, died four years ago. He was a member of the Apostolic Christian Church here. He leaves six children, William, of DeMotte; Mrs. Andrew Nussbaum, Robert J., and Harry F., of Remington; Chris R., of Galveston and Mrs. Howard Schaibley, of Frankfort; three brothers, Godford and Adolph Bahler, of Rockville, Conn., and Jacob Bahler, Sr., of Remington, and 16 grandchildren.

Mrs. Elizabeth Bingham Passed Away Yesterday

Mrs. Elizabeth Bingham, ages 72, a highly respected resident of this city for many years, passed away at the home of her son, Walter Bingham, at Cassopolis, Mich., yesterday morning at 4:30 o'clock.

Mrs. Bingham had been ailing for some time and her son came down the latter past pf last week to take her home. The trip was made Tuesday, a local physical accompanying her as far as Chicago. A telephone message telephone message received here Tuesday evening from the son stated that his mother, although tired, had stood the trip well, and was resting easy. Another message yesterday morning told of her death.

The remains will arrive here tonight, and the funeral services will be held tomorrow afternoon from the Christian Apostolic Church.

In 1880 the family made the ocean trip to America, arriving in this city on May 9. On January 3, 1883, she was united in marriage to Herbert G. Bingham, who together with three sons, Benjamin, Edward and Herbert, and one daughter, Marie, have preceded her in death. Surviving her is one son, Walter, of Cassopolis, Mich., at whose home she passed away. There also survive four grandchildren.

Mrs. Bingham had been a resident of this city for over 47 years. During this long period of residence here she had by her thoughtfulness of others and her kind disposition made many lasting friendships. She was a fine Christian woman and those who knew her best loved her most.

Mr. Broquard died at 12:30 a.m., Sunday, April 2, 1989 at Fairview Haven Nursing Home where he had recently resided and to which memorials may be left.

He served as a minister of the Apostolic Christian Church from 1937 until retiring in 1984, and was an elder of the church from 1946 until that retirement.

Rev. Christian Gerber Dead

Passes Away Suddenly Thursday Afternoon at His Home

Rev. Christian Gerber, one of the best known of the German residents of this locality and a preacher of the German Apostolic Church, died suddenly at his home south of Fairbury Thursday afternoon about three o'clock while at work in the hay field. He was stricken with apoplexy, and altho medical aid was at once summoned he had passed away before the physician arrived.

Rev. Gerber has lived on his farm south of Fairbury for many years. He was a man who stood high in the estimation of all who knew him and one of the chief conselers of the German Apostolic Church. His death is a great shock to his many friends as he was apparently in the best of health.

The funeral services will be held Sunday, July 17, at 12 o'clock, at the South German Apostolic Church.

Fairbury Blade - July 22, 1910

Death of Rev. Christian Gerber

The further details of the death of Rev. Christian Gerber add but little to that published in the Blade last week. Rev. Gerber was working in his hay field and was walking and driving the head team hitched to a hay loader. John Hoerr, who was walking with the loader was first to notice Rev. Gerber's absence. The team went by and Mr. Hoerr notices the lines were dragging. He looked back and saw that Mr. Gerber had fallen in the tracks of the loader. He had evidentially been stricken and stood up for a moment or two before falling. When Mr. Hoerr and the others reached his side he was still alive and breathing heavily. Death occurred in about five minutes.

Obituary

Christian Geber was born in Wayne County, Ohio, Dec. 12, 1848. When a boy of 11 years his parents moved to Iowa and the family resided there for five years and then they moved to Tazewell County near Morton III. On January 20, 1870. He was united in marriage to Miss. Barbara Roth and to this Union seven children were born, three dying while young during an epidemic of scarlet fever. The children living are Anna, Lydia, Katie and Christian, all at home.

Mr. Gerber with his family came to Livingston County to live in 1875, settling on the present home farm, where he has lived continuously since that time, loved and respected by all his neighbors and all who knew him.

There are few men who rise to that place in the hearts of the people who know them, that Mr. Gerber had risen, and few men who know tested by the trails of life prove so worthy. For over twenty years Rev. Gerber had been an elder of the German Apostolic Church and he not only stood high in the councils of his church, but was loved and revered for his rugged honesty, his high moral character and the earnest Christian principles he set forth in his sermons and in his life. He taught his people to shun the vanities of the world and as he taught so he lived. He traveled from coast to coast and crossed the ocean twice on missionary work. He was a man of pleasant disposition, and one whom it was a pleasure to meet at any time. He was widely known among his church people, many of whom had been married by him, and he had preached at funeral in many families. He was one of the

leading men in the German Apostolic Church and for years held position of great honor. His life was one that might be emulated by all.

The funeral services were held Sunday at noon at the south church and were perhaps the most largely attended of any ever held in this section of the state. It is estimated that there were fully 2500 people who assembled to pay their last respects to the memory of the deceased. Among the towns and cities represented by visiting delegates were the following:

Morton, Eureka, Princeville, Roanoke, Peoria, Elgin, Mackinaw, Gridley, Meadows, Forrest, Cissna Park, Wolcott and Remington Ind., and others points. A special train was run from Bloomington to Cropsey and a Special train carried the people west from Fairbury in the evening. Rev. Engweiler, of Mansfield Ohio, preached the funeral sermon, talking for his text the word, "In my Father's house there are many manisons, if it were not so I would have told you." He preached an eloquent sermon, dealing with the life and character of the deceased. The expressions of sorrow over the death of the deceased was universal among those assembled. There were said – to have been almost 500 carriages to convey the people to the cemetery where the remains were laid to rest.

Rev. John Gerber Dead

News was received in this city on Saturday of the death of Rev. John Gerber at Bremen, Ind., his home. The news caused a chock of surprise and sorrow among the many old friends of Rev. Gerber in this city who supposed he was in the best of health. Rev. Gerber was in good health until a few hours before his death, which was thought to have been caused by rheumatism of the heart. Joseph Unsicker, north-east of town, had been visiting Rev. Gerber and other friends in that locality and was present during his last moments. He said that Mr. Gerber complained of a pain in his left shoulder and breast for two days previous, but it was light and he did not think it amounted to much. A few hours before his death he was taken very severely and sank rapidly until the end.

Rev. John Gerber was widely known not only in this immediate locality but in this section of the state. He lived southeast of Fairbury for a number of years and was highly esteemed by his neighbors and the citizens of Fairbury. He was a minister of the German Apostolic Church and two years ago he purchased a farm and moved to Bremen, Ind., where he farmed his land and on Sundays preached for his people.

Fairbury Blade – April 5, 1912

Sudden Summons

Rev. John Gerber, who moved here a year or so ago from Fairbury, Ill., died suddenly Saturday forenoon at his home some five miles northeast of Bremen of neuralgia of the heart. He had suffered no serious illness and only the night before was at the home of his daughter near by until 10 o'clock. Saturday morning he was taken with severe pains in the region of the heart and they resulted fatally in a few hours.

Mr. Gerber was 63 years old March 6. He was born in Ohio, his father dying when he was four years old. He lived for a time in Iowa, going from there to Fairbury, Illinois, where he lived for 22 years. He moved to Bremen, Ind., March 1911. He was a man of kindly, genial disposition, had been a minister of the German Apostolic faith for many years and enjoyed the respect and esteem of all who knew him. Was the father of eleven children, Mrs. Edward Getz, William, Mrs. Edward Hirstein, Mrs. William Leman, Miss. Leah, Sam, Louis, Jeptha, of Bremen; John, of New Boston, Ill.; Mrs. Joseph Nussbaum and Joseph, of Fairbury, Ill. There were also 32 grandchildren, and these with the bereaved wife and numerous friends mourn his death.

Funeral services were conducted Tuesday afternoon in Grace U. B. Church, which was secured for the occasion, followed by interment in the Bremen Cemetery.

It was one of the largest funerals ever held in Bremen. More than 700 people crowded onto Grace U. B. Church, while many were unable to gain admission. Rev. Michael Mangold, of Roanoke, Ill., preached the sermon and half a dozen other ministers were present. More than 400 friends were here from distance, coming from Peoria, Fairbury, Eureka, Roanoke, Gridley, Forrest, and Cissna Park, Ill.; Croghan, N. Y.; Wolcott, Remington and Milford, Indiana, and other points. A higher tribute to the worth of a good man could scarcely have been paid. Rev. Geber was esteemed one of the ablest preachers of his faith and was an object of regard amounting to veneration. - Bremen Enquirer.

Nicholas Keller 1831 – 1890

Fairbury Blade – August 16, 1890

Died

Nicholas Keller, whose serious Illinois was mentioned in these columns last week, died shortly after midnight Tuesday. The attending physicians gave the friends but little hope of recovery from the beginning of the fatal attack, and he gradually grew weaker, until he sank to the sleep that knows no waking, surrounded by his sorrowing family.

Mr. Keller was a member of the German Apostolic Christian Church, and one of its ministers and his name is familiar to every member of that denomination in central Illinois. He had a wide personal acquaintance in this vicinity. His sterling character and strict business integrity endeared him to all who knew him. His death is deeply deplored.

The funeral which took place from the Apostolic Church, Thursday afternoon, at 1 o'clock, was very largely attended, many friends of the deceased coming from a distance to pay their last tribute to the memory of a good man. The clerk at Walton Bros.' where Mr. Keller had held a positions for some time. Attended the funeral in a body, as a mark of respect to their late fellow clerk.

Nicholas Keller was born in Canton St. Gall, Switzerland, Nov. 20, 1831, and was, therefore, 59 years, 8 months and 28 days of age at his death. At the age of 19 he graduated from a seminary, and entered upon the profession of a school teacher, which he followed four years. He emigrated to America in 1856, making the trip on a sail boat in 37 days, and located in West Virginia, where he worked as a farm hand with slaves. In 1857 he removed to Monroe County, Ohio, and was married to Maria Seggessemann, the wife who survives him. To them were born a son and a daughter both of whom, now married, also survive him. In 1863. Mr. Keller moved to Illinois and located in Woodford County, engaging in farming, removing thence in 1869, to Livingston County, settling within a mile of where the village of Wing now is. After a severe illness in 1874 he came to Fairbury and engaged in the sash and blind manufacturing business with J. Von Tobel and J. Keller under the firm name of the Germania Manufacturing Co., which business he followed for about two years. Since then he had been engaged different lines of mercantile business, - boots & shoes, groceries, etc. In 1876, Mr. Keller in company with his twin brother visited his old house in Switzerland. The two bore such a striking resemblance to each other that the one was frequently taken for the other. At the time of his death Mr. Keller was contemplating taking up his permanent residence on his farm, as he was tiring of business life. Owning to his liberality and great confidence in his fellow men, his business ventures proved unsuccessful, and to retrieve a portion of his losses he engaged in clerking, being physically unfit for the labor of farm life. He joined the Apostolic Church in 1840 and was a consistent member of the same to the hour of his death.

Rudolph Leuthold 1813 – 1892

110 Years of "North Side" Apostolic Christian Church History By Ben Nussbaum

Rudolph Leuthold came to this country from Zurich, Switzerland in 1868 and we assume that is where he was also born in 1813. With previous pulpit experience in Europe, he was welcomed to the north side where, in addition to ministering, he shortly replaced Virkler as elder. Since Virkler was his junior by three years, there was speculation that some jealously may have existed between the two, although Virkler's health was probably the prime consideration.

Leuthold was both elder and trustee to the south side in its infancy. He possibly served in the same capacity at Fairbury since his 1868 arrival predated that of the Steidingers by about seven years. John Georg Steidinger did not assume the south side and Fairbury elderships until sometime after 1875.

Rudolph Leuthold served the north side long and well as their elder before relinquishing the position to Jacob Honegger, his death occurred on March 27, 1892 and burial was in the church cemetery.

Daniel Roth died Monday night at 11:30 at his home east of Fairbury. The deceased had been in poor health in recent years and had made repeated trips to the health resort at Latham, Mo., in the hopes of being benefited. He left here the last time in March and remained there with his family for three months, returning home Friday last, with but little signs of improvement. Funeral Services Held From Apostolic Christian Church; Burial in Gridley Cemetery

John Schieler passed away at 5:30 o'clock on Sunday morning, at his home in the East part of Gridley. After a two weeks' illness. Unassuming in his ways, and a man of sterling honesty, he was highly respected by a large circle of friends. He was one of the leading members of the Apostolic Christian Church.

Mr. Schieler was born in Germany on August 7, 1861, coming to the United States when a young man. With his parents, he settled on a farm near Fairbury. Later he moved to a farm near Remington, Indiana. He retired in 1914, taking up his residence in Gridley.

Mr. Schieler leaves his wife, one son, John Schieler, of Remington, Indiana, and two daughters, Mrs. Mary Schambas, of Elgin, and Mrs. Lena Huber, of Remington, Indiana. Mr. Swing formerly of Ackron, Ohio, died at his home in this township. Tuesday evening, aged 67 years. His funeral was attended Thursday.

The Historical Encyclopedia of Illinois and History of Illinois, Volume II - 1909

Carl Swing was born at Frankfort-on-the-Maine, Germany, and amid scenes familiar to the great Goethe, passed from boyhood to manhood, equipping himself in the meantime in the art of ladies' high class tailoring.

From the first dawn of seriousness his nature was profoundly religious, and this inclination grew in after years to potential proportions.

Realizing that the United States offered larger opportunities than existed in his native land, he came here while still a young man, and after locating in Akron, Ohio, married Salina Bollinger, a native of Schaufhausen, Switzerland.

In 1877 he brought his family to Livingston County, locating on a farm south of Chatsworth, where his death occurred August 10, 1880, while at the zenith of his powers.

The untimely passing of Mr. Swing was the more to be regretted, as he had just become located in the midst of the most favorable of agricultural surroundings, and it seemed that many more years of happiness and usefulness remained to him.

His tailoring or farming operations were really secondary avenues of activity, for his mind and heart dwelt constantly upon the moral condition of the race and for many years he sought its uplift as a preacher in the German Christian or Amish church.

The self-sacrificing and impersonal labor of Amish clergy appeals to men of high moral caliber and unselfish character, as they received no stipulated compensation, working solely for the cause in which their sympathies are enlisted.

Mr. Swing was an exception even among these consecrated men, and his devotion and faithfulness won him the confidence and gratitude of many outside his own denomination. He had a hearty, cheerful greeting.

In his wake, there arose better community feeling, greater honesty, nobler aspirations and cleaner, saner living, and of him it may be truthfully said that he left the world the better for his having sojourned in it.

The wife whose aims and sympathies were so closely knit to those of Mr. Swing survived him until February 9, 1900.

To them were born five sons, of whom John, the oldest died at the age of twenty-nine years; Charles died in infancy; Henry is a farmer near Remington, Indiana, and as were his parents, is a member of the Amish church; Albert also is a farmer in Wolcott, Indiana; and Joseph G. is a merchant in Fairbury.

Peter W. Sommer 1843 – 1920

Fairbury Blade – February 20, 1920

Peter Sommer Dead, Formerly Resided here

The Peoria Star of Tuesday contained a notice of the death of Peter Sommer, of that city, who passed away at St. Petersburg, Fla., Monday, where he had gone to spend the winter. He was 75 years old. Mr. Sommer resided here in his younger days and owned the farm where the South Christian Apostolic Church now stands.

The Star in Speaking of His Death Says:

Peter Sommer, father of president P. W. Sommer of Keystone Steel and Wire Co., who, in a little wooden shed in Tremont, Tazewell County, wove the first wire fence, nucleus of the giant Peoria industry of today, died at 11 o'clock Monday morning in St. Petersburg, Fla., where he had been spending the colder months at the winter home of his son. His ailment was angina pectoris. His age was 76 years.

Peter Sommer was the inventor of the wire fence. Thirty-one years ago he conceived the idea of weaving wire into a "new" kind of fence. With his sons John and P.W. he designed and built his first weaving machine in a frame building still standing in that village. His first string of fence created a sensation among the farmers. They saw it was cheap, practical and a great saving of labor. The little plant was soon outgrown and a larger one was built. That was __ turn outgrown and besides his sons the inventor was employing several men.

In 1895 when it became evident that Tremont could not supply facilities for making and shipping fencing, the ______ came when the conservative inventor decided to move to Peoria, which he did in 1895, locating on South Adams Street. Although this plant was much larger, it, too was soon outgrown and then followed the removal to the manufacturing suburb of south Bartonville.

The fence and the machine for its weaving were perfected and the brand was made "Square Deal." Addition after addition came rapidly and then the steel mills with their three open-heart furnaces each representing a million dollar investment, the vast structures of rod mills, blooming mills, soaking pits, etc., connected with five miles of private switch tracks and a canal a mile or more long from the river. It is a far call from the wooden shed in Tremont to the steeldale of today, the culminations of Peter Sommer's dream. The keystone story is an industrial romance.

Mr. Sommer held the position of vice-president in the vast enterprise he founded, but had retired from active management of its affairs and with his wife, divided his time between their home in Colorado, in Peoria and in Florida. Mrs. Sommer was with him at the time of his death, as was his son, P. W. Sommer. B. L. Sommer left for Florida yesterday and John Sommer today. The body will be brought to Peoria for commitment in Springdale Cemetery.

Peter Sommer was a man of simple and kindly life. He was a member of the Apostolic Church, a man whose simple word was his bond, honored and respected of all. He was born in Tazewell County, near Pekin, in 1844, and when 21 years of age was married his bride Miss. Mary Breisacher. He followed his trade as wagon maker in the village of Morton. Later he moved to Fairbury where he lived on a farm until he moved to Tremont.

Conrad Steffen Dies Suddenly Near Cropsey

Conrad Steffen, one of the highly respected and well-known farmers residing south of this city in the vicinity of Cropsey, was found dead by members of the family Tuesday evening a little before six o'clock, death being caused by apoplexy.

Mr. Steffen together with others of his family had been to Forrest that afternoon in his car, and when they arrived home a little after five o'clock, he told the others to go into the house and he would drain the radiator and put the car away. When he did not return within a reasonable time members of the family went out to see what was keeping him. They found him lying dead just outside the garage by the side of his car. A physician was summoned, but life was extinct.

Mr. Steffen had seemed to be in usual robust health and his death was not only a shock to his family, but also his acquaintances.

Conrad Steffen was born on the old home place near Cropsey, November 24, 1869. Twenty-nine years ago he was united in marriage to Kati Hari who together with the following children survives: Walter, Anna, Mary, Tillie, Ben and Katie. All of the children reside at home, with the exception of Walter, who is married. There also survive two brothers and two sisters – Albert and Andrew Steffen of Cropsey and Mrs. Carl Huber and Mrs. Gottlieb Hari, of Strawn.

For 26 years Mr. Steffen had resided on the place where he died and during that he had gained the confidence and respect of all who knew him. For a number of years he had acted as pastor of the South Christian Apostolic Church, from which place the funeral services will be held this afternoon.

John G. Steidinger

John Georg Steidinger was born at Baden Germany, April 3, 1825 and died at his home in this city, Monday morning at three o'clock, aged 81 years, six days. He grew to manhood in his native home, coming to America in 1875, coming direct to this city. About a month after arriving here Mr. Steidinger purchased the home farm in Avoca Township, where he resided until the death of his wife.

He was untied in marriage to Miss Anna Mary Yackley in 1844, at Baden Germany, and traveled life's pathway together until April 27, 1902, when Mrs. Steidinger passed to her rest. Sixteen children were born to them, eight of whom are living, John, John G., Mrs. Sallie Bittner, Andrew, Mrs. Mary Ramseyer, Martin, Alex, Anna L., and Bartel. All the children reside in this vicinity.

Mr. Steidinger was a minister of the German Apostolic Church in Germany and was one of the first ministers of that church in this city. He was true Christian and a citizen, who held the respect and esteem of all who knew him.

The funeral services were held at the German Apostolic Church Tuesday afternoon, Revs. Gottlieb Hohuling, of Macanaw, and M. Mongold, of Roanoke, officiating. A large number of friends from neighboring towns, as well as neighbors and friends in this city were present. The remains were laid to rest in the Fairbury Cemetery.

Jacob Von Tobel 1839 – 1933

Fairbury Blade - March 2, 1933

Jacob Von Tobel

Jacob Von Tobel has gone to rest. He passed away at his home in this city yesterday morning, March 2nd 1933, at 5:20 o'clock at the age of 93 years, 11 months and 7 days. His death came after an illness of about two and a half months duration.

Mr. Von Tobel was born March 26 1839, in Meilen Canton, Zurich Switzerland. He received his early education in his native land, and it was there that he took up the trade of cabinet maker. In 1868, lured perhaps by the letters his friends sent him about the land beyond the stormful Atlantic, He decided to migrate to America. This was about the time that America was undergoing many changes during the period of reconstruction following the Civil War. This ambition-fired young cabinet maker, however, saw in this land only opportunity, as it had never been offered to him before.

Upon his arrival in America he came directly to Fairbury. Here he followed the trade of cabinet maker for a time and after a few years engaged in business for himself. After a time he broadened his business to include building operations, and one of his first undertakings was the remodeling of the old Mitchell House, which later came to be known as the Fairbury House.

Ever progressive in spirit Mr. Von Tobel become a leader in business activity in this community. His next move was his entrance into the lumber and building material business in this city. His first yard was located on what is now known as central park. It took in this entire space before its expansion was complete. In 1900 he was ready to retire. His son-in-law, J. N. Bach, carried on the business which he left, and the business he founded is still in existence today.

On March 19 1871, Mr. Von Tobel was united in marriage to Miss Catherine Keller, a girl from his native land. Mr. and Mrs. Von Tobel were the parents of twelve children, four of whom survive. He also leaves a sister, Susan Von Tobel, who has made her home with him for many years; twenty-one grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren.

Mr. Von Tobel so lived his life that anyone might well profit by his example. Fair in his business dealings, kind to his family, loyal to his friends and true to his faith, He will always be remembered as a man among men.

He was a member of the Apostolic Christian Church and one of its most faithful members and followers. For many years, until his increasing years would no longer permit him to officiate, He was a preacher in the local church. Under his guidance the church grew to be one of the strongest bodies in this community.

His friends have always enjoyed passing his way and in these later years it was a real satisfaction to hear his assurance of the future when they paused to pass the time of day with him. Always his answer was the same to the question of "Good morning. Mr. Von Tobel, how are you?"

"Well, thank you. But I am an old man now, and I have lived a long life and I am ready to go."

Funeral services will be held from the Apostolic Christian Church Sunday, with burial at Graceland Cemetery.

Heinrich Ziegenhorn died at residence in Claytonville, Tuesday morning, Dec. 11, 1906, at 2 o'clock. Before his death Mr. Ziegenhorn did not complain of any ailments but seemed to grow weak, and death came as a peaceful sleep.

Heinrich Ziegenhorn was born in Prussia, Oct. 19, 1823. When a young man he became a mechanic.

He was married to Dorotha Schmidt in Prussia about the year 1850. Six children were born to them in Prussia and France where they lived for seven years.
