Sermon by Bro. Mike Baumann, Mansfield, OH

Amos 7 and Luke 21

We have read a rather lengthy chapter but I did not know just where to break and as the Spirit directed me, I kept on reading. We have read a portion of Scripture that belongs to the last days of the Lord Jesus Christ here upon this earth. As He went into the temple, it says here He looked up. As the Lord goes through our church today, I am quite sure He is looking up.

He saw the rich men casting their gifts into the treasury and He also saw a certain poor widow casting in thither her two mites. He noticed both the rich and the poor. Loved ones, it is really not wrong to be rich. Money is a good servant, but a poor master. If we let money master us, we will indeed be poor, no matter how much money we have.

He looked also at the poor widow. There is a lesson in that—a lesson for me in this at least. The Lord sees how much we give and He warns us in other Scripture passages that when we give, we should not give that men might see us and that we might receive a great reward and a pat on the back. He sees how much we give and He also knows how much we have left. doesn't He, according to this Scripture passage? He knew that the rich gave and they gave of their abundance. He knew that the poor widow gave and that she had nothing left. He knew how much was left for the widow. He knows us. also, how much we give and He knows how much we have left.

Then they came and spake to Him about the adorning of the temple. Normally, it is referred to as Herod's temple. Herod built this temple and he wanted to please the Jews and be a good Roman ruler. It was so beautifully adorned, historians tell us, that in the mortar joints of the temple, they placed gold. It was beautifully adorned and it was a big temple. They wanted to point that out to the Lord Jesus.

Loved ones, speaking about in our first meditation in reading of the future, what about the future of these thirty-eight verses? How these two beautifully blend together!

Here is the Prophet of prophets, the Son of God. The greatest teacher that ever walked upon this earth is Jesus Christ.

They have asked Him, but shouldn't He look just at the temple? They have received a lot more. I'm thankful that God gives us whenever we ask of Him, not just what we ask, but our cup runs over. Wouldn't you say the cup of these disciples ran over? Loved ones, it has been preserved for us, and for us especially because we believe we live in the last of the latter days.

There are really two prophecies entwined one into the other. It is hard for me, but maybe some of you can do it better than I can. I cannot really tell you where it starts and where it begins, but there is definitely two prophecies that our Lord prophesied here. One, the destruction of the temple and the driving of the children of Israel among all nations. That took place in the year 70 A.D. They rebelled against the Roman Empire and for those who have been to Rome, (I've been there twice) there is a big statue of Titus the

Great.

In the year of 70 A.D. they laid siege to Jerusalem and destroyed it and made sure that there were no Jews living in Jerusalem. The temple was taken apart stone by stone just as the Lord said, "...there shall not be left one stone upon another." (Luke 21:6). Brothers and sisters, God's Word—every Word—means what God said. There is nothing left out. We need to read slowly and carefully because if we leave one or two

Steadfastness

"Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye stedfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labour is not in vain in the Lord" (I Cor. 15:58).

In an era that displays a great deal of instability, the general trend among mankind is significantly reduced commitment to the family, to the place of employment, to the community, or to the church. The children of God must carefully examine their attitudes and commitment to serving God.

There are a significant number of factors contributing to this problem. The self centered philosophy of our time encourages individuals to place self above family, community and God. The rapid change in technology requires many heads of families to change jobs far more frequently than was the case only a few decades ago. The global economy requires some corporations to be very flexible with their work force in order for them to remain competitive.

In the not too distant past a father could choose an occupation and expect to spend his entire working life in the same job. Although the standard of living was significantly lower than it is now, this long term employment in the same job generally provided significant stability for families.

Sons tended to follow their fathers in the same line of work. Multigeneration families reinforced stable values from one generation to another. This stability extended to the church where it was far more likely than today that families worshiped together in the same church all of their lives.

As the Industrial Age gave way to the Information Age, extremely rapid changes occurred. As these rapid changes occurred, workers, which unfortunately now includes many mothers as well as fathers, are often required to make frequent, sudden and drastic changes. Parents are often required to choose between economic sacrifice or social upheaval by moving their families to new communities. Although this phenomenon is not entirely new, the

speed and frequency with which it occurs has increased almost beyond comprehension.

This has had a powerful impact on families. It is more important than ever that parents provide a spiritual atmosphere that brings stability to the family.

As children of God, we have access to an anchor that will provide the needed stability for our lives and for the lives of our children. The Word tells us that "...I am the Lord, I change not;" (Mal. 3.6) and "Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and to day, and for ever" (Heb. 13:8). God's mighty creation offers us evidence of His might and stability. We may be fortunate enough to fly high above God's earthly creation and see land forms created thousands of years ago that are evidence of God's power and stability. Mountains rising thousands of feet in the air stand firm against the tide of change.

God's children have access to stability if they are willing to be steadfast and unmovable in their faith. The tenants of faith that were so important to the prophets of old, and to the early disciples of Christ, have not changed.

The Bible gives us many examples of steadfastness among God's servants. Josiah, in performing his duties as King "...did that which was right in the sight of the Lord, and turned not aside to the right hand or to the left" (II Kings 22:2). Job, in the face of terrible trials "...held his steps, his way have I kept, and not declined" (Job 23:11). The three Hebrew children, facing the wrath of King Nebuchadnezzar and the fiery furnace said "...we will not serve thy gods, nor worship the golden image..." (Dan. 3:18). Peter and John said "... Whether it be right in the sight of God to hearken unto you more than unto God, judge ye. For we cannot but speak the things which we have seen and heard" (Acts 4:19-20). Paul in facing certain death said "But none of these things move me, neither count I my life dear unto myself, so that I might finish my course with joy...to testify the gospel of the grace of God" (Acts 20:24).

The perfect example of steadfast-

ness, of course, is Jesus Christ. Having been in Heaven, totally free from trials and temptations, He was willing to come to earth to face the temptations that Satan would bring. He knew what was before Him; and the sacrifice that was necessary to make the way of salvation possible. Jesus "...stedfastly set his face to go to Jerusalem" (Lk. 9:51) to pay a debt He did not have, because He knew we had a debt we could not pay.

As God's children, we can be beneficiaries of Christ's redemptive work if we will be steadfast in our faith and our service to Him. To this end we receive encouragement from many places in the scripture. "Stand fast therefore in the liberty wherewith Christ hath made us free, and be not entangled again with the yoke of bondage" (Gal. 5:1). Peter encourages us to resist Satan and be "...stedfast in the faith, knowing that the same afflictions are accomplished in your brethren that are in the world" (I Pet. 5:9).

We know that in the last days "perilous times shall come"

(II Tim. 3:1) and that conditions of sin will get worse. We also know that God has placed a limit to how far He will allow people to go in sin. To avoid the fate that awaits the unfaithful, we are urged to "...continue thou in the things which thou hast learned and hast been assured of, knowing of whom thou hast learned them;" (II Tim. 3:14).

In the Revelation of St. John, all of the seven churches were told that they had work to do to achieve the mark of perfection. In each case there was a promise made "...To him that overcometh..." (Rev. 2:17).

We have a duty and a wonderful opportunity to search for the truth of God's Word and to apply it to our lives. God's promise to those who remain steadfast is as sure today as ever. We must all hold fast to the promises of God that we can reap the benefits awaiting those who are faithful.

Distribution Centers and Material Aid Coordinators

God has blessed our Apostolic Christian Church with many material blessings. We thank Him that He has also placed in the hearts of our brethren to share these blessings with those less fortunate. Good stewardship of donated funds and goods requires diligence and organization.

New committee created

To coordinate all of the activities across the nation, the World Relief Committee (WRC) appointed a group of brothers to establish a workable arrangement for efficient handling of material goods. It was called the Material Aid Committee (MAC), and they have met several times.

The brethren who coordinate operations on a day to day basis were added to the MAC, and as things progressed, some members dropped off the committee. This left a counseling elder, four coordinators, and a name change to Distribution Center Coordinators' Committee (DCCC).

Goals and function of DCCC

The goal of this group is to use God's blessings to His Glory, and the furthering of His kingdom here on earth. They request and need the support and cooperation of our brotherhood, in particular those who are involved in WRC activities.

Material Aid Centers

The WRC presently has four international Distribution Centers. They are located at Bay City, MI, Bluffton, IN, Fairbury, IL and Goodfield, IL.

Efforts are under way to create a fifth such facility in central Ohio. Many of the items that are shipped to the needy are being assembled by brethren and friends across the land. They are later sent to one of the Material Aid Centers. This has created an opportunity for those who desire to help the needy both here and abroad to do so without traveling.

Goods originate at home

The efforts which are ongoing on the local congregation level are the basis of what finally goes through these facilities to the needy around the world.

Both the World Relief Committee and the DCCC directors want to thank everyone who contributes to this program, no matter how small you think your effort is. Tiny grains of sand make up the shore which hold the great ocean in place, and small deeds of kindness bring help to many in great need.

Examples of useful items

Some examples of goods made and packaged by brethren and friends include: comforters, layettes, bandages, homemade soap, motel soap, health kits, sewing kits, pre-natal kits, edible beans, etc. The list could go on and on, and just because a product is not listed here does not mean it is not appreciated or beneficial. Reality is that if something would be useful in your home, it can be used in those countries we supply with aid. However, shipping costs must also be taken into consideration.

Crisis In Yugoslavia Our brethren continue to suffer

s the war continues to affect our A suffering brethren in Yugoslavia, the European Board continues to monitor the situation. This Board held a conference call on Tuesday, May 18. At that time they explored the various options in bringing assistance to this troubled group of souls.

There is no mail service into Yugoslavia, but we are grateful for the modern means of communication. Up to this time we have been able to communicate by e-mail and sometimes by telephone. The advantage of e-mail is that it can be sent during the times when the electricity is on in Yugoslavia. Often this window of opportunity is very short. The recipient can access this message at any time after it is sent. Some of us who are older do not fully understand this process, but it is a part of the world we live in. We appreciate this means of contact, as other means continue to become more limited.

Letter from an elder

On May 17 we received a letter from an elder in Novi Sad, which has been hard hit by bombing. He does extend his greetings to all the American brethren, pleading at the same time

for our prayers.

The situation is very serious as the bombing of this stricken land continues. Our brethren avoid all political involvement, choosing rather to remain separated from the world and trust in God for protection. Thus far, there have been no human casualties among our people. There has been destruction of property, and loss of employment, which means no income. The elderly are receiving only half of their pensions, and sometimes not even that. To address these needs, we continue to send funds to them.

Gettina funds in

The letter stated that they can still get consumer goods in the country, and our best means of help is by furnishing funds to purchase these items.

However, even the means of transporting funds are becoming less. A railroad overpass just south of the Hungarian border was bombed. This means there is no train service to Hungary. Thus, no one can ride the train across the border to pick up

money or supplies.

No male between ages 16 and 65 is permitted to leave the country. Few, if any, men over 65 or women of any age can drive a car. We are fortunate to have someone from Germany who is still able to cross the border without problem, and can assist us in this endeavor. Please pray for their safety.

Elders meet together

The Yugoslavian elders meet regularly to discuss the best means of providing for their suffering flocks. Our relationship with these brethren is good, and God has provided means where we can work together. And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose. Romans 8:28

Fuel is very scarce

Fuel for transportation is very badly needed at this time. However, if anyone is caught trying to bring some into the country, the penalty is very high. The brethren feel that the risk is too great at this time for anyone to expose themselves to danger by attempting to carry fuel in.

Worries about an invasion

The military presence is virtually everywhere, in the city and also in rural areas. It appears the government is preparing itself and the people in case an invasion should come. This

could be catastrophic for our brethren, 85% of whom live in the area through which ground troops could possibly attack if they come through Hungary. Although their faith is strong and they have numerous converts since the war began, anxiety is high among the brethren in the war zone.

It is very hard for us who live in peace to imagine the pressures placed on those who are living through a war. We hope we never find out, but this is not impossible in the day in which we live. Prayer, the source of our strength from God, is of utmost importance. In times like these all of us need to use it more.

Building a church

The letter stated that they continue to work on church buildings under construction. They requested our support to begin work on another new building. This would do several things. Many brethren are laid off, and could work for pay on the building instead of just being given money. There would be a testimony of faith to the others in the country that we trust in God. This was approved. However, a danger exists that religious persecution could again rear its ugly head.

Kosovo refugees

The European Board approved sending funds to assist the Kosovo refugees through Christian Aid Ministries. We often cooperate with them on projects such as this, and are comfortable with their methods of operations.

To sum it up

As one looks at the whole picture, the only bright spot remains our trust in God and His great mercies.

If you wish to help financially, we suggest that you do so through your local church. Funds will be forwarded to the National Mission or World Relief Committee.

APOSTOLIC CHRISTIAN HOME FOR THE HANDICAPPED

We are pleased to let you know about a major change the Home is putting in place. After much soul searching and discussion, the name of our large home is being changed from Apostolic Christian Home for the Handicapped to Apostolic Christian Timber Ridge.

Many of you have known us since the Home began as just an idea in the minds of some parents. We know there was a great deal of discussion about who would be served and what to call the Home. Since services began in 1971, the name of the Home has been the Apostolic Christian Home for the Handicapped. As times change, so does the meaning of words and how we use them. We have known for some time that our name was no longer accurate and that it was not sensitive to the people we serve. Most of us live in homes, subdivisions, or apartments that just sound like a home. The names of our subdivisions or apartments don't say who lives there or why. We believe the people we serve would like the name of their home to also sound just like a home. While we wanted to change the name, we felt strongly about keeping the Christian identity and the church affiliation as a part of the name.

There is an additional reason for making this change. We have grown from the original home and added additional smaller homes. This has created some confusion in the names of the homes. Originally the name of the large home and the name of the agency were the same. As we have added places, it has become problematic to have the agency and the large home the same. When people call or talk about the large home, they no longer know what to call it. We believe that giving the large home

its own name will clarify this. The legal name of the agency will continue to be Apostolic Christian Home for the Handicapped. We will use this for legal purposes and, when appropriate, to communicate with the churches.

We have discussed this new name with families, residents, staff and others and it has been well received. We are excited to put this in place and hope that all of you can also be comfortable with the change as well. A name change will inherently cause some confusion and some questions. We ask for your patience and cooperation in this change.

Sure, I've put aside my plans for the day to do something for him, but that's just a normal part of parenting that evervone does.

For the past three years, I have had the privilege and opportunity to work with the sons of two men who have made great sacrifices for their sons. These two men do not even know one another, but their stories are very similar. One is from Albania, the other from Jordan. I met each of them when they enrolled their sons in Urbana High School where I am a counselor. In each case, the father was the only one in the family who could speak enough English to communicate with me. A very educated man in his 50's, the father from Albania left behind a government job as a physicist. He had a relative living in our city and saw an opportunity

to improve the life of his family (his wife and son) by leaving nearly all earthly possessions, the security of a job, and family and friends to come to the United States. In the years since they arrived, his son has quickly learned English, excelled academically, and has been accepted into the University of Illinois. The family is supported by the mother's work in service occupations, as the man himself has been unable to locate a steady job. Each time I speak with the father, he is grateful for all that anyone does for his family and seems to have no regrets regarding his decision and sacrifices.

The father from Jordan has a similar story. He and his wife have a larger family of younger children. As an engineering worker for the airlines in Jordan, he had a good and comfortable job, but he knew that his children could have more opportunities if they lived in America. They, too, left all they had and moved to Urbana speaking limited English and having only the promise of help in finding housing and employment. Today, the family has been here for over two years and has established themselves. The father is not working in a job at the level he previously held, but is working at an international grocery that one of his friends owns. His sons work in an ethnic restaurant, and his wife attends classes at Parkland College. This man is one of the most concerned fathers I work with, always checking that his children are doing well and becoming quite upset with them if they are not taking full advantage of the opportunities at hand. He knows what he has given up, why he has done it, and what he hopes for in return. The most frustrating, maddening, disappointing thing in his thinking is that one of his sons would turn his back on

what his father has done for him.

As this Father's Day comes around, I think of these two men-both fine gentlemen who would deny that they had done anything remarkable or worthy of much mention-and I think of how poorly I compare to them. Although I doubt that I'd ever find it necessary to make the same decisions they have made on behalf of their families. I wonder what that would even be like. Would I be willing to give up so much? Relating this to our position as Christians, it makes us aware of how God sacrificed His Son for us; how in turn Christ has given so much for us and asks only that we take full advantage of the opportunities provided for us through the sacrifice of another. I wish my Albanian and Jordanian friends a very happy Father's Day with their families in Urbana.

words out, we have lost the total message that God has.

This temple was so destroyed that nothing can be found except one wall that has been excavated. The Lord left just enough evidence that when the next temple is to be built, they know where to build it.

It has been said that when the Romans came and started laying siege and circled the city of Jerusalem, the church was still in Jerusalem and it was still the "home parts", so to speak, of the church in Jerusalem. The Lord here said that when you see that time come, it was normally you go behind the walls. There were fountains in Jerusalem, there were storehouses. there was a wall around Jerusalem and if the enemy attacked, it was but for one purpose. That was all there, you go behind the walls for security.

The Lord said to do the opposite. When you see these things, when the destruction of Jerusalem shall come, you go out. If you are in the mountains in Judea, don't go into the city; go the opposite direction. It should not be strange to us, brothers and sisters, that God's children go the opposite direction of the Lord. If you and I—let me humbly say that—find ourselves in step with the world, let us stop and examine where we are going. Most likely, we are going the wrong direction.

The Lord told those people and it is said that this word was read when Titus the Great came and laid siege to the city of Jerusalem before the circle was completed. The church escaped because it heeded the words of the Lord Jesus Christ. They took each other by the hand and walked against the masses. The masses came into the city and the small number of the

faithful walked out of the city. The church was saved.

While you are in Rome today, if you go, go to the coliseum. It was built by eighty thousand captive Jews that Titus the Great brought back. Forty thousand of them died while building the coliseum.

In the future, one of the things that the Lord said here was that we need to be careful not to be deceived. Oh, the plumb line of God's Word. It is good that we don't go by our feelings or by what we think, but that we go by the Word of God.

Recently I heard an elder brother say in Mansfield, "The person that is deceived is always the last one to know that he is deceived." Everyone else around you knows it except the one who is deceived. Oh, how true that is!

My, dear ones, the nation of Israel was dispersed of all nations. When this Word opened, I know what the twenty-first chapter in the gospel of Luke says. Just this past week, I was so richly reminded in private—in a private setting with about ten or twelve of us around the table—of the coming of the Lord. I wonder if I need that more than anyone else because this is the Word that opened.

The people, for one thousand nine hundred years, have been dispersed among all nations. Do you know of any religion of any nationality, of any race that you can find someone in every nation? None, but the Jews. Do you believe the Word of God is true? Oh, what a refreshing it is for me this afternoon to be able to know that the Word of God is unfailing.

My dear ones, the prophet Ezekiel in the thirty eighth chapter from the eighth to the twelfth verse says there will come a time when Israel will be back in the land and they will live at peace. Loved ones, Israel has been back for fifty years and the prophet is specific as it says in the latter days, not just any time, but in the latter days, Israel will return. For fifty years, we have lived in the latter days, brothers and sisters.

What is the most important thing that the world is trying to do, especially this country? They are trying to bring peace to Israel. Peace treaty. Peace treaty. Brothers and sisters, according to the Scripture, not according to the newspaper, Israel will have a peace. It will look so good that they will trust in it. They will not wall, they will disarm, they will have no walled city, they will be prosperous and then they will be attacked by a nation from the north, and that is the beginning of the end.

In II Thessalonians, the second chapter, the Thessalonians were waiting for the return of the Lord already. In fact, some of them quit working. The Apostle Paul told them what time it was and what they have to look for. He gave them several signs in the second chapter, if you would like to read it at your own convenience.

Again he comes out and warns the Thessalonians that they be not deceived. How important it is that we be not deceived this afternoon. Brothers and sisters, I did not seek this word. He tells us also what first must come to pass. One of the things that will come to pass is that there will come a great falling away. Now that is not people that live in darkness, brothers and sisters, those are people that have repented and are converted. I ask you a question on God's time table: "What time is it?"

Next, the son of perdition will be

revealed. He will set himself up in the temple of God shewing himself as God. Right now there is no temple built. A temple has to be built according to that Scripture passage. On the temple site sits part of the Dome of The Rock. I have never been there, but that's what I have been told. What do you think will happen, my dear brother and sister, when the wrecking ball pulls up to the Dome of The Rock and starts

swinging at it? There could come times when it would come worse and there could come things that will come to pass in a speed, such as we have never seen before.

It will overtake the world as we have read here, but those of us that are not deceived, that are spiritually awake, vibrant, filled with the Spirit of God, lifting up our heads, we will see that the time is drawing near. Loved ones, the time clock, even as we have here, is not made for us to adjust it to fit our lives, The time clock is for us to adjust our lives to the time clock. The time clock of God is given to us so we would live according to the clock that God has given to us.

I have given this example before but let me give it again from every day life. Many of us travel at airports and we sometimes have quite a long lay over. I do, too, sometimes have a lay over. Having had a pilot's license at one time and flew, I am interested in flying. Go to the airport with me and you will often hear and see it. The first

call is for first-class boarders. Second call is for row one through thirty or whatever it is. Then, thirty through fifty or whatever it may be boarding. Then, loved ones, there comes a call that says, "Final boarding call."

I remember one time standing across (it was not my flight) just watching people going in. People came in on the final boarding call. After that, the people who were at the desk went over to the door and gently closed the door and hung a velvet string across the door. The door was closed. The aircraft was pushed away and started to take off. Just as it was roaring down the runway, here comes a man running. The lights were out already.

He said, "Is this for flight 200?" Or 100 whatever he was looking for. "Yes." He said, "Did it leave?" They said, "Yes, it left." He said, "It can't leave. I have a ticket. I am only a little late. Where are they?" "Sorry, the flight left." He said, "I have a family waiting on the other end. There are people looking for me. I must attend something." He had to go somewhere, as I listened to him. He walked back and forth. He walked to the door, turned around and came back. He tried to open the door and there was nothing there. The door was closed. He missed the final call. The first call, the second call and then the final call.

Loved ones, the Lord is coming. I am not saying tomorrow, but it may be tomorrow. Be sure our living in the last days is according to

the Scripture, not my feelings or your feelings and not someone's headlines, but according to Ezekiel, the thirty-eighth chapter, when the children of Israel are back in the land.

The land, after one thousand nine hundred years, is in the possession of God's chosen people again, though disobedient they are. They are still working and depending upon themselves in trying to work out their own soul salvation by their own strength.

Loved ones, may nothing else concern us. Of all the headlines that you see daily in the paper and hear on the radio and wherever you see them, nothing is more important than that little strip of land by the Mediterranean where God placed His name four thousand years ago when He sent His called and chosen Abraham to offer his son Isaac. That is the most important headlines to watch. That is a time clock that will tell us what time it is.

The Lord Jesus tells us this afternoon, "Be not deceived." Brothers and sisters, may we be found faithful when He comes. He will come at midnight at the darkest hour. Can you not tell that the hour is getting darker and darker? We are of the light and we can see what is going on.



This is a continuation of excerpts from the book entitled "The Nazarenes In Yugoslavia."

The Nazarenes, in this instance, are the offspring of the Froehlich movement in the Balkan states. This book lists the many difficulties believers had in dealing with governmental authorities, especially while serving in the military as noncombatants.

We today can learn many lessons from these devout forbearers. Among those are devotion to keeping God's ways, and a special God-inspired courage to not relent in the face of ungodliness. The comments below occurred in the 1920's.

The Nazarenes in Yugoslavia again and again have given assurances that they are ready, at once and gladly, to serve their time as soldiers in the sanitary service, or if this is not possible, among other unarmed troops. Indeed, they have even made the offer to the War Office to serve a longer period, in case it would comply with their request.

Besides the men already mentioned, there are still more than fifty other young, active men imprisoned in Yugoslavia, every one serving a sentence of 4-8 years. Some are kept in solitary confinement, while others must mingle with the worst criminals; and all this for conscience's sake.

Among the prisoners in Peterwardein there are Nazarenes who ought to have been excused from all military service, because they were physically disabled in army service to the extent of 30 percent. These have again been sentenced to 9-10 years imprisonment.

A Nazarene in Srem (25 years old) was sentenced since the close of the

war, because he refused to take up arms, for the sake of his conscience, to five years in prison. After having served half of this time, he was "pardoned" by the king and set free. He was called into the army again and sentenced anew to nine years in prison.

The distress of the Nazarenes in Yugoslavia could not remain a secret. Their brothers in faith in Switzerland and in America became interested in the case. In January, 1927, four Swiss brothers made a trip to Yugoslavia to investigate the troubles. They were convinced of the truth of these facts.

In the beginning of February, 1927, another group of 80 Nazarenes were sentenced to 9 1/2 and 10 years in prison.

Now the Society for the League of Nations in Switzerland interceded in their behalf. In a meeting of the International Commission for Minorities held in Brussels on February 23, 1927, Prof. Bovet appealed to the delegation from Yugoslavia, and this delegation promised: To redress the grievances. As a result of their magnanimous mediation the king pardoned more than 200 Nazarenes on March 7, 1927. They were dismissed from prison. But more than 50 young, active men remained prisoners in the various prisons

In order to get these men out of prison and, perhaps, to bring the problem of taking up arms closer to a solution, three Swiss brothers went once more to Yugoslavia in July, 1927. The king had gone to Bled (Slavonia) to take up his residence in this health resort. They waited for three days trying to get permission to see the king, but to no avail. They could not pene-

trate "the iron ring of the court."

The joy of those who were pardoned March 7 was of short duration.

On the 11th and 14th of July, 1927, the Nazarenes were again called into the army, only Nazarenes, up to 50 years of age. Nearly all those who had been "pardoned" March 7, were again imprisoned. The torture began anew: To swear and to take up arms and to renounce the faith of the Nazarenes. As they refused to do so, they were tried again in court. Practically all of them have again been sentenced six to ten years in prison at hard labor. Among them are men who are completely "unfit for military service."

Since that time men have constantly been called singly into the army. Only Nazarenes. No other persons. Men, 40 to 50 years of age, who have never served in the army are called.

A young Nazarene in Srem-Mitrovica is said to have been examined four times by the army surgeons, and each time declared to be completely unfit for military service. But the commandant in authority took away his certificates and his testimonials and had him escorted under military guard to a distant cavalry barracks.
